Bottoms:

Tops:

- Plain, or embroidered with a logo, sky blue or white polo shirt or plain white button shirt.
- Navy jumper or cardigan with or without logo.

Footwear:

- Low-heeled dark coloured shoes or dark coloured trainers.
- PE
- Trainers
- A plain white polo shirt or T-shirt should be worn with plain dark shorts in summer.
- In winter plain tracksuits may be worn.
