



Year 6s are really enjoying learning about statistics in maths, as it is really challenging but strengthens our brains. We have been loving our Ancient Egyptian topic over the past term. We have focused mainly on primary and secondary sources and how useful they are to historians. JT told us a fun fact: the larger they drew the people or hieroglyphics, the more important they were in society.

In science this term, we have been learning about properties of materials where we have been able to do a science experiment each week. Our definite favourite was when we mixed bicarbonate of soda and vinegar to show an irreversible change. We learnt that this solution was irreversible because a gas was produced through lots of fizzing! Kingfishers visited Grasslands Farm on Tuesday where we learnt about how a mixed farm works. This farm had cattle and chickens - we got to hold newborn chicks which were very cute but lively! We got to experience what it would be like to go through a cow crusher and physically see how many humans it took to pull a piece of farming machinery. Horsepower is definitely stronger but JT, TN and AG gave it a good go. In the afternoon, we enjoyed the sunshine whilst completing a physical grid reference challenge, working our way around the fields. With Mrs Wilson in Art, we are becoming amazing photographers by recreating famous pictures and editing them on software. We love changing the tone, brightness and experimenting with our designs to see how creative we can be.

Some funny things have happened this term! Miss Bryant got squished in a cow crusher when we went to the farm, as we believe Miss Marshall did when she went with Robins! It was very uncomfortable and most of Kingfishers wanted to leave her there. Miss El Oakley's impressions when we are doing our creative writing sessions always make us laugh! The accents really add to the storytelling and characters.

We are looking forward to SATs (!) and completing our DT projects next term which will involve us practising our sewing skills. We are looking forward to putting our skills to the test.
