Looking ahead: key messages and reminders

Warmer Weather

As we begin to have warmer weather, please apply sunscreen before your child comes to school. If you would like them to reapply it during the day, please ensure the bottle is labelled clearly with their name and class. They will have the opportunity to reapply it themselves at break time and lunch time. Younger pupils may need an opportunity to practise this at home first. It is also important that your child brings a water bottle into school and a sun hat with their name clearly labeled. Please **do not** send your child to school with a fan of any description as they will be asked to put this away in the classroom to minimise disruption. The temperature of the classrooms are carefully monitored and classroom fans will be provided if necessary.

Behaviour Chart

This half term I will be reviewing the behaviour chart used in school. Pupils, staff and parents will be invited to share their views. We will continue to use the 'Going for Gold' behaviour chart and we will discuss what each colour behaviour looks like to ensure we have a clear set of expectations. We may adapt some of the current statements based on the feedback and we will create a clear and consistent language for everyone to use. Once the pupils have had their say, I will share the updated behaviour chart with you all. Each week in assemblies we will be focusing on behaviour and our school values: Kindness, Respect, Teamwork, Creativity and Success. Pupils will be set a challenge to practise over the week. So far we have seen a great response around showing Respect. We have been saying 'good morning,' 'good afternoon,' 'please,' and 'thank you!' We have even learnt how to say thank you and you're welcome in Makaton. Pupils have also been trying to think about valuing everyone's opinions and seeing things from someone else's point of view. Teachers had a difficult job selecting pupils for the celebration assembly this week as so many pupils have been respectful!

Caterpillars! We are really looking forward to the arrival of our caterpillars and watching the life cycle of a butterfly in action.




Dispatches from Woodpeckers

Dispatches from Kingfishers


What are you enjoying learning about at the moment? Why? Any fun facts?
