# Dim Sum Palace by X Fang



Inspired by childhood memories of epic dim sum feasts, X. Fang's glorious picture book is a delicious adventure with a loving helping of food, family and culture.

The **official winner** of the Waterstones Award was The Cafe at the Edge of the Woods by Mike Please.





Told in witty rhyming text and adorned with evocative illustrations reminiscent of Jon Klassen and Maurice Sendak, children will adore this laugh-out-loud funny stew of the heartwarming and the grotesque, as a little imagination and creativity ensure that a visiting ogre gets just the monstrous meal he requested.

The robbers have stolen all of the children's toys from Christmas.


What is your favourite part of the story?

Yes because it's a really fun book that made us laugh.




# Year 2 Charlotte's Web by E.B. White

When it was talking about when the boothook man and the Malamander having a big fight. The book told us that Captain K was actually Captain Crackin.


When they found out Erwin (the cat) could talk.


#### Reading Ambassador Prizes
